

FF Skagen has ordered a new mobile harbour crane to strengthen their logistic posture

FF Skagen A/S is one of the world's largest producers of fishmeal and fish oil. Founded more than 50 years ago by fishermen and still primarily owned by fishermen and the fishing industry, focus is on highest product quality and sustainability.


Exporting to over 60 countries, products are mostly shipped in containers and with the new crane, these will now be sent off directly from the company's own terminal in the Port of Skagen, at the northernmost tip of Jutland.

The new crane has 125 tons lifting capacity at 18 m radius. Designated G HMK 5506, it is a versatile machine, designed for professional handling of containers and heavy lifts as well as bulk with motor grab.

Centrally located in one of Denmark's most attractive and busiest summer holiday towns, environmental issues also played an important role, when opting for the Gottwald crane. It is worth noting that besides being the most energy friendly solution the new, diesel-electric crane is also the most silent on the market.

The new Gottwald crane will be operational after the summer of 2018.

Technical Director Thomas Rasmussen is looking very much forward to take delivery of the new crane that was selected after extensive field studies and talks with other Gottwald crane operators, both in Denmark and Germany.
